Let Freedom Sing: The Story of Marian Anderson is a modern form of opera; part song cycle, part oratorio, but opera is at its heart. Four singing actors tell the story of the famous contralto's life as an artist. Marian Anderson was an important figure in the struggle for African-

American artists to overcome racial prejudice in the U.S. during the mid-twentieth century. She was celebrated as a star in the opera houses of Europe and at the New York Metropolitan Opera, but during her rise to stardom could not stay in fine hotels or eat in restaurants with her fellow cast members because of the color of her skin. By her dedicated pursuit of excellence, she overcame many inequities to become one of the most famous singers of the 20th Century and an icon of the civil rights movement. It is a story of hope and triumph.
